
Beethoven Anniversaries

We celebrate two great anniversaries this year with Beethoven's Ninth Symphony and his »Missa solemnis«: Both works were premiered 200 years ago – a programme highlight at this Beethovenfest.

The melody from the final movement of the Ninth became world-famous as the European anthem. Also, the »Solemn Mass«, as the Missa is translated, is an exceptional work by Beethoven. It intensifies the religious tone of the church ritual with great artistic freedom into a choral symphony. Seldom is »Togetherness« so effectively invoked as in these major Beethoven works. This remarkable music comes onto the stage at the festival with outstanding artists, orchestras and choirs. Yet not only in traditional form, but also using contemporary approaches – because Beethoven's music consistently stimulates new creativity.

The classical performances of both pieces are confronted by several modern adaptations and new interpretations. For the Ninth Symphony, composer Tan Dun conducts his commissioned work »Nine. Ode to Compassion«. The Opening Party has a >Ninth to Join In< in the open air together with choir, orchestra and a sign language choir. The creative vocal ensemble A Song For You develops a »Soulful Missa« from the »Missa solemnis«. And music producer Stimming creates an interactive sound installation from the »Dona nobis pacem« of the Mass.

»Together«: The value of the liberal democracy

Our liberal democracy currently faces several challenges. Markus Gabriel, one of the best-known German philosophers and professor at the University of Bonn, nevertheless considers »moral progress in dark times« to be possible. He is campaigning for a »new enlightenment« and understands democracy to mean not just the interaction of complicated bureaucratic procedures, but the mutual struggle for solutions to which everyone can agree considering a universally valid set of values. In his opening lecture, Markus Gabriel examines the basic principles and requirements of our democratic togetherness. He thinks about art and culture as a space where ambiguities are withstood and assessed and moral judgment is playfully rehearsed.

Several (fee-based) circular cycle tours start out from Schloss Miel, led by the musicians from »Bach by Bike« – with open-air concert experiences. 




